Remember that on **February 2nd 10am-12noon** at **Twin Lakes Park** there will be a **free Clover-bud Fun Day** where 4-H youth 5-7 years of age are invited to learn about turtles, plants, marine science and fishing. Each activity will last for 30 minutes. We encourage non-4-H youth to also attend to participate in this hands-on educational event. Fishing rods will be available for use by those who need them.

At a recent **4-H marine science exploration** field trip to S. Lido Beach youth caught barracuda, filefish, porcelain crabs, sea horses, snapper, sponges, sea cucumbers, needlefish, pipefish and a variety of other creatures. Participants learned to identify and classify these marine organisms. **Wilkinson Elementary School** will be partnering with 4-H in a similar educational field trip during the month of March.

There are many **judging opportunities** at the Sarasota County Fair this year which include Live-stock, Consumer Choices, and Horticulture. The Fairboard generously donates premium money for these events which allows 4-H youth to compete through educational competition. Participants need only check-in on the day of the events to get involved. Check your Fair rules book for the date and times of these events.

During the month of January, I had the pleasure to join the **Horse N' Around Club** on one of their many **community service** projects in Sarasota. We visited the Floyd Retirement Center in North Sarasota and were able to share holiday gifts with the residents and introduce them to members of the 4-H club. All those who turned in entry forms will receive a letter of confirmation and a scheduled time for your activity. Please check your confirmation carefully to make sure that all the information is correct.

Winners in each category (Individual and Team) will advance to District Events on May 3rd. Junior and Intermediate District winners will receive a scholarship to Camp Cloverleaf June 16–20, Senior District winners will advance to State competition during 4-H Congress in Gainesville July 21–25th.

Mandatory Work Day

There will be a mandatory Fair Work Day for **ALL 4H EXHIBITORS** at the Sarasota County Fair Grounds on Saturday, March 8th 8:00 AM-Noon.

ALL EXHIBITORS must sign-in at the large animal barn. If you are exhibiting in the large animal barn, small animal barn, mini building, plant tent, dog, llama, mini horse etc... that means EVERYONE signs-in, in the large animal barn between 7:30 and 8:00 AM.

Groups will be assigned to help set up the Barns, Mini Building, Plant Tent, 4-H Stage, decorate and beautify the fair grounds. Please bring brooms, shovels, rakes, and gloves, etc... and remember to label all items for identification.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS!

All exhibitors are required to work in ALL buildings / barns that they are exhibiting in. Parents will be responsible for providing adult supervision during these shifts. Please review your 2008 Sarasota County Fair Rule Book for complete guidelines. Failure to work during your assigned shift(s) may result in forfeiture of premiums.

Mini Building Sign-up

If you have a project in the Mini Building you must sign up for a two-hour shift. Two children and one adult are needed for each shift. If you can help out and work an additional shift that would be greatly appreciated! Please contact the 4-H Office at 861-9812 / 861-9810 to schedule your shift(s). If you do not sign up you will be assigned a shift during workday on Saturday March 8th.



Don't Forget Your Fair Passes

The 4-H Office will distribute Fair Passes at the end of Workday, on Saturday, March 8th. *You must sign-up for all your work-shifts prior to receiving fair passes.* All 4H members with projects entered in the Fair will be eligible to receive one exhibitor pass and two additional parent passes. Families with more than one 4H member exhibiting will only receive two parent passes. The 4-H Office receives a *limited* amount of passes (from the Fair Office) based on the number of Fair entries. We cannot accommodate requests for additional passes.

Plant Show and Sale Exhibitors

Be sure to sign-up for your "plant show and sale" work-schedule in the Plant Show and Sale Tent during workday on Saturday, March 8th 8:00AM.

Small Animal Barn Sign Up

If you will be showing a small animal (rabbit, poultry, cavy) you are required to sign up for a work shift(s) in the small animal barn. Please sign-up by calling Mrs. Annis at 322-0690 *after* February 22, 2008, between 7:00 and 9:00 PM.

Large Animal Barn Sign-up

Work shifts for exhibitors showing beef breeding, dairy, goats, steer, and swine will be available by calling Jennifer Armstrong at 322-6424 or Christina Schook at 322-8512 beginning Monday, February 25. Locker assignments will be scheduled by club and will be available to club leaders at workday on March 8.

ATTENTION: 4H LEADERS AND PARENTS OF EXHIBITORS

Volunteers are needed to help supervise the 4-H and FFA exhibitors in the large animal barns during the fair. Contact Christina Schook to sign-up at 322-8512.

Are You UP-TO-DATE ?

Your Record Book is a very important part of your 4H Project. It is important that you know where and when your record book is due. Check your fair rules, ask your leader, or call the 4-H Office 861-9812. Late books will be penalized.

Remember, part of the criteria to determine Superior Exhibitor Awards is *your* record book score.



Changes and Updates for Steer and Swine

Entry dates will remain the same, only the sale dates have changed:

Steer Sale: Friday, March 21—7:30 PM

Swine Sale: Saturday, March 22—6:30 PM

For buyers who are personally taking their Steer or Swine purchase with them, the following applies:

Buyers will be required to pay for their purchase on auction night.

Steers: Buyer pick-up Saturday, March 22 from 7:00 AM—10:00 AM

Swine: Buyers pick-up Sunday, March 23 from 7:00 AM—10:00 AM

Exhibitors are not required to be present when buyers pick-up the animal. Exhibitors are required to have their name on the halter for easy identification.

Exhibitors *are responsible* for feeding their animals on Sunday, March 23.

All other steer and swine will be leaving on Monday, March 24 AM.

Exhibitors are not required to be present during the loading of these animals.

Exhibitors are required to clean out their lockers and pick up their items on Monday, March 24 between 2:00 PM and 7:00 pm

READ THIS!

Attention Swine Exhibitors

All Swine must be bled and tested for pseudorabies and brucellosis by a certified veterinarian between February 18, 2008 and the entry to the fair to be eligible for the fair.

Time must be allowed for results to be certified and received by the fair office. Test conducted more than thirty (30) days from the entry date of the fair will be disqualified. **Failure to have the blood test will result in disqualification from the fair. (Page 21 Rule 15).**

The livestock Committee will help you facilitate the process by having a veterinarian at the Farm Bureau facility located at 7289 Palmer Blvd. on Monday February 18th, Tuesday, February 19th and Wednesday, February 20th, between 5:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M..

There will be a \$6.00 charge for the tests, please have the correct change.

We can not handle all swine on the same day. Please call Don Strickland at 371-1771 to schedule your date.

If you choose to have your veterinarian do the testing, it is your responsibility to see that the paper work is in the fair office by 5:00 P. M Friday March 14 ,2008.



Mini Building Entry Tags

The 4-H office will be sending out Mini Building Entry Tags with instructions to all Mini Building exhibitors.

Please make sure tags are **filled out correctly**, and attach **securely** to each item that you are entering.

This will eliminate delays at check-in. If you have any questions please contact the 4-H Office 861-9812.

Mini building check-in is Wednesday, March 12th between 3:PM - 7:PM. You must turn in your **completed recorded book** at that time.

Entries will not be accepted with out your record book!

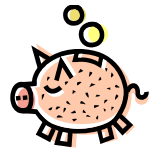
2008 Area E T-Shirt Design Contest

WHOOF! Is Anybody Listening?

Dogs do talk, but most of us don't understand a word they say. Here's a brief guide to common canine vocalizations... short, high-pitched barks demand attention from a family member or friend; lower-pitched longer barks protect territory or warn of an invader; howling or mournful barks mean loneliness; whines seek attention; whining yawns indicate anxiety.

4-H Day at the Capitol

4-Hers from around the state will again converge around the Capitol to learn more about their government, visit historic landmarks and meet with their legislators on March 14. In the past, 4-H has been recognized on the floors of the House and Senate as well as having the day be proclaimed 4-H day! Basic Beliefs about Recognition in 4-H Youth Development Programs

Recognition for 4-H youth and volunteers is based on the following beliefs:

Recognition is a basic human need.

Recognition builds positive self-esteem (for competencies demonstrated).

A balance between intrinsic (self-evaluation) and extrinsic (rewards given by others) recognition is essential.

Everyone needs to be recognized at some time for their efforts.

Recognition is more meaningful when it occurs soon after it is earned and is related to a specific task.

Appropriate recognition for an individual varies depending on their age, past experiences, family lifestyle, community and cultural heritage.

Recognition is more meaningful when given by someone closely related to the person.

Recognition motivates people to excel and take worthwhile risks.

Individual choices in learning and participation need to be allowed and recognized. Recognition and awards programming in 4-H is a strategy for helping people become more capable and competent. Through the acknowledgement, affirmation and positive reinforcement of each person's effort, feelings of competence and capability increase and participation continues.





February is Heart Health Month!

The Colors of Health

It's important to have a colorful variety of fruits and vegetables everyday. Colorful fruits and vegetables provide the wide range of vitamins, minerals, and fiber your body needs to stay healthy and full of energy. To make choosing your fruits and vegetables easy, keep in mind 5 color groups: blue/purple, green, white, yellow/orange, and red. The goal is to eat about one cup from each group everyday!



By including a colorful variety of fruits and vegetables from the five color groups in your low-fat diet everyday, you can help maintain a healthy HEART!

Lets All Focus on Fruits

At breakfast, top your cereal with bananas or peaches; add blueberries to pancakes; drink 100% orange or grapefruit juice. Or, try a fruit mixed with low-fat or fat-free yogurt.

At lunch, pack a tangerine, banana, or grapes to eat, or choose fruits from a salad bar. Individual containers of fruits like peaches or applesauce are easy and convenient.

At dinner, add crushed pineapple to coleslaw, or include mandarin oranges or grapes in a tossed salad. Make a Waldorf salad, with apples, celery, walnuts, and dressing. Try meat dishes that incorporate fruit, such as chicken with apricots or mango chutney. Add fruit like pineapple or peaches to kabobs as part of a barbecue meal.

For dessert, have baked apples, pears, or a fruit salad.

As snacks: Cut-up fruit makes a great snack like pineapples or melons. Or, try whole fresh berries or grapes.

Snack Idea's - That Taste Great!

Calcium: Snack idea. Boost your calcium intake by blending low-fat chocolate milk, a banana, and ice into a delicious smoothie for a quick dessert, or snack

Fiber: Snack idea. Spread crunchy peanut butter onto celery sticks, top with raisins for a favorite "ants on a log"

Protein: Snack idea. Trail mix is a great portable snack that is also easy to prepare. Throw together a mix of dried fruits such as raisins, bananas, apples, or dried cranberries, nuts (soy nuts or peanuts), and high-fiber cereal.

Antioxidant: Snack idea. Parfaits are beautiful to look at and fun to eat. Make one by layering low-fat yogurt, fresh or frozen blueberries, and toasted almonds into a tall glass.

Iron: Snack idea. Wrap an iron-fortified whole-wheat tortilla with sliced turkey, low-fat string cheese, and dried cranberries for a healthy snack.

Let's Get Physical !

Physical movement requires energy that burns calories, the type of exercise that uses the most energy is aerobic exercise. The term "aerobic" is derived from the Greek word meaning "with oxygen."

Aerobic exercise uses the body's large muscle groups in a continuous, rhythmic movement. Jogging, brisk walking, swimming, biking, and dance are just some aerobic exercises that can be done with friends or in groups—and can be a lot of FUN!

The longer you move aerobically, the more energy needed and the more calories used. Regular aerobic exercise will improve your cardio-respiratory endurance; and you will build a healthier YOU!

4-Steps to Success

Losing and maintaining weight lose is not easy. Below are some tips to help make the most of your efforts:

Exercise. Studies show people who maintain their weight loss for years generally accumulate at least one hour a day of physical activity. It doesn't matter what you do as long as you use your muscles.

Cut Portions, Cut Calories. We have become accustomed to Super-sized servings - we often eat more calories than we need. Many people lose weight by simply reducing portions.

Prepare Mentally. Be ready for permanent change. Decide your not on a "diet" temporarily; your starting a life long new behavior!

Eat Regular Meals. Fasting or skipping meals may lower your metabolism. It also invites fatigue and can trigger over eating later.

A Quick Tip:



Looking for a way to cut the sugar in your favorite recipes? Try this: Reduce the sugar by one-third to one-half the original amount. Then enhance the flavor by increasing the amount of vanilla, cinnamon or nutmeg.
