## Start Your Engines

Do you eat breakfast? Do you fuel-up to get started? Not only is breakfast important, but what you eat for breakfast may affect your ability to learn in school. The best breakfast choices include colorful fruits and vegetables, whole grains, low-fat dairy, lean meats and other protein. Choose nutrient rich "power foods" to start your day.

### Try: Banana Split Cereal

Who said banana splits were only for dessert? Yogurt, cereal, and fruit combine to make a powerhouse breakfast!

1 small banana

1/2 cup fresh blueberries or other fresh fruit

1/2 cup nonfat or low-fat vanilla yogurt

1/2 cup low-sugar cereal (such as Cheerios, Wheaties, or Bran Flakes)

#### DIRECTIONS:

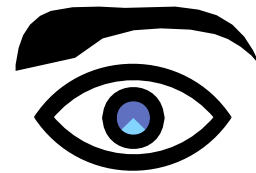
1. Peel the banana and slice it lengthwise
2. Wash the blueberries, (If you are using another fruit, wash it and cut it into small pieces.)
2. Spoon the yogurt in a mound in the center of a cereal bowl.
3. Sprinkle the cereal on top of the yogurt.
4. Arrange the banana halves on either side of the yogurt.
5. Sprinkle the top with the blueberries or other fruit.

## The Eyes Have it!

Your eyes are amazing, you use them from the time you wake up in the morning until the time you close them for bed every night. Most people take their eyes for granted... until there is a problem.



It is important to protect your eyes with safety glass when you play sports or work on projects, and be sure wear sunglasses when you are outside to protect them from the sun's harmful rays. Don't ever rub your eye—you will only damage them. Do you know why onions make you cry? Your tears work to protect your eyes from strong fumes (like onions), smoke, and dust. Anything that irritates the eye can bring on tears because the eye will try to wash it out. Cold air or wind will make your eyes water, too.

There are many old wives' tales around about your eyes. Here are a few vision facts...

**MYTH:** If you cross your eyes, they'll stay that way.

**FACT:** No, contrary to the old saying, children's eyes will not stay that way if they cross them.

**MYTH:** If I have poor eyesight, my child will inherit that trait.

**FACT:** Unfortunately, this one is sometimes true. If your parents need glasses for good vision children may inherit that same trait.

**MYTH:** Children should eat carrots to improve their vision.

**FACT:** Although it's true that carrots are rich in vitamin A, which is essential for sight, many other foods (asparagus, apricots, nectarines, and milk for example also contain vitamin A. A well-balanced diet can provide the vitamin A needed for good vision!

**MYTH:** Using computers damages a child's eyes.

**FACT:** According to the AAO (The American Academy of Ophthalmology), computers won't harm your eyes. However, when using a computer for long periods of time the eyes blink less than normal. This makes the eyes dry, which may lead to a feeling of eyestrain or fatigue. So, it's a good idea to make sure you take frequent breaks from the computer or video games.

**MYTH:** Only boys can be color-blind.

**FACT:** It's estimated that up to 8% of boys have some degree of color blindness, whereas less than 1% of girls have the same condition.

## Does This Collar Make Me Look BIG?



Just as with humans, one of the biggest health problems today for dogs is obesity. Many owners think their pudgy dogs are adorable, when in fact they are extremely unhealthy. Overweight dogs can develop the same kinds of problems that overweight humans do - such as diabetes. Obesity can also reduce your dog's life expectancy.

Dogs can be great beggars, but don't let yours charm you into sharing your food. Never give your dog chocolate, it contains theobromine, a chemical that is toxic to dogs. Dogs love vegetables such as broccoli, carrots, zucchini, cauliflower, peas, and beans, and fruits such as bananas, apples, and melon, these make great low-calorie treats.

There is a very easy way to check if your dog is overweight. A normal weight dog should have an indentation at his waistline, and his ribs should be easily felt under his skin. An overweight dog will not have a waistline and there will be a thick layer of fat over his ribs. Your dog relies on you to keep him in good health. A proper diet, regular exercise, grooming, and routine check-ups will help to keep your dog in top form.

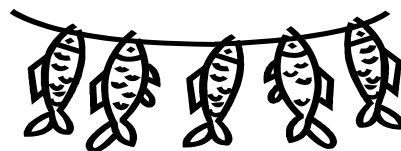
#### Leadership Involvement Fitness Enthusiasm

## Florida 4-H Legislature 2007 by: Sean Russell

Florida 4-H Legislature 2007 started off with a bang! The "bang" of a gavel that is, as this event's 35th session began. Florida 4-H Legislature, a week long mock legislative session for senior 4-H members is held every year in our state's capitol. At this event 4-Hers take on the roles of lobbyists, reporters, representatives, and senators and debate on, pass, and fail bills that have been written by 4-H youth from across the state.

This year's Legislature began on Monday, June 25th as 4-Hers checked into Smith Hall on the Florida State University Campus. After settling in, participants were welcomed to Legislature and participated in strategy sessions with their respective committees and groups to prepare for the upcoming week. Following the strategy sessions, participants dined in the Suwannee Room, one of FSU's eating areas, before heading back to Smith Hall where they participated in get to know you games to become better acquainted with the people they would be working with for the rest of the week.

Another highlight of Monday at Leg was the voter registration process. Participants at Leg are required to register for either the Gold or the Green Party (Green being the more "conservative" party and gold representing what some would consider the "liberal" party). This registration process determines the majority and minority parties in the House and Senate. This year the Green party was the majority in the House. But, for the first time ever, the Gold party was the Senate majority party.

Tuesday morning began with a joint opening session which took place in the House of Representatives at the capitol. At this session, the 4-H Governor, the Lt. Governor, the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate, as well as all of the other participants at Leg, were sworn in as part of opening ceremonies. At this year's ceremony, 4-H leadership also presented a resolution honoring Florida's 4-H Legislature program for receiving the title of "National 4-H Program of Distinction" from 2006-2009. Another resolution was presented to Florida Boy's State, who was also staying in Tallahassee, recognizing their organization effort's to teach youth about the government process. The remainder of Tuesday was spent with the Representatives and Senators in their respective committee meetings. Here they debated bills assigned to their committees and ultimately determined which bills would come up for debate by everyone in the House and Senate. During these committee meetings, lobbyists were given a chance to persuade senators and representatives to vote for or against a particular bill.

After a very successful first day at the capitol, Leg participants held committee office hours back at the Smith Hall dorms on Tuesday night. This gave lobbyists another chance to talk with committee members about the bills that would come up the next day. Wednesday began the first day of House and Senate sessions for Florida 4-H Legislature. In these sessions intense debate was heard and votes were counted to determine which bills would end up on the Governor's desk. Wednesday's time at the capitol ended with a press conference where Florida 4-H Governor, Mylo Cheng, announced he would be signing into law, two of the three bills that had passed in both the House and the Senate. Also on Wednesday, lobbyists took part in a special activity at the Florida Supreme Court. One exciting activity that took place Wednesday night was a trip to Jack McLean Park for a "Political Picnic" dinner and recreational activities. At the park, 4-Hers were able to enjoy a playground, basketball courts, an indoor recreation room, a dance, and a pool with a water park!

On Thursday, the final day at the capitol for Leg participants, there was a sense of urgency in the air. After all, this was the final day for debate and passage or failure of bills. After rounds of intense debate, which finished this year's session, both the House and the Senate set aside thirty minutes for their "joke bills". The House's joke bill pertained to making apple pie Florida's state pie and banning key lime pie in Florida. The Senate's joke bill was about declaring a snake round up day in Florida. Then the 35th session of the Florida 4-H Legislature was adjourned with the traditional "sine die" ceremony and a closing press conference.

For their, last evening in Tallahassee Legislature participants attended an elegant closing banquet which was held at the Tallahassee Civic Center. At this banquet Governor Cheng signed four bills into law. 4-H members who distinguished themselves as outstanding lobbyists, reporters, representatives, and senators were recognized with Chris Allen Awards. A Founder Award was presented to an adult volunteer for their service to the Legislature program. The banquet ended with a formal dance. Later that evening, upon arrival back at Smith Hall, graduating senior 4-H members participated in a "Senior Farewell" by sharing their heartfelt thoughts on their time in 4-H and what it has meant to them.

This year's Florida 4-H Legislature session was a big success. Special thanks go to the Florida 4-H Legislature Planning and Adult Steering Committees, event volunteers, and every single youth participant who became absorbed in their role to make this event as realistic as possible. Although the 35th session of 4-H Legislature ended on Thursday night, all the participants left Friday morning. They left with a challenge to go back to their communities and take the skills they gained, through this educational program, and use them to make a positive difference in their clubs, communities, country, and world.
